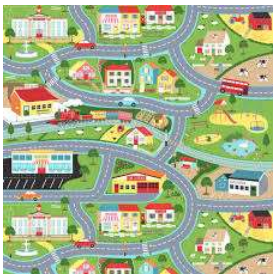


1. Draw a road map including traffic lights and a zebra crossing and then drive your cars around it.



Challenge – can you label the objects that you have drawn on your road map?

2. Can you make an alphabet car park for your toys? Get a large piece of cardboard (or card/paper) and make a grid that is 5 rows along and 5 columns down. Then write letters along it, can you park your toy cars in it? What letter have they parked on?



3. Play 'Guess the Transport' with a member of your family. Firstly think of a type of transport, then describe it without saying what it is. Can your family guess what it is from your clues?



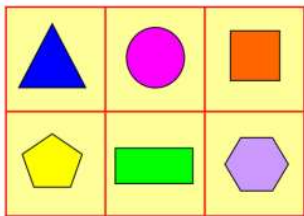
4. Doodle Arm – Firstly draw around your hand and arm and fill it with doodles. What do your hands like to do? Bike rides? Cooking? Drawing? When you fill your hand/arm with doodles, you might consider the things you are currently missing or the things you are currently enjoying doing whilst being at home with your family.



5. Find two or more different objects around your house with wheels and see which can travel the furthest with just one push. Can you measure how far each vehicle has travelled using something in your home? (E.g. Duplo or Lego).

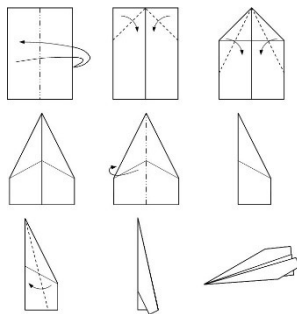


6. Look out of a window in your house. How many different shapes can you spot? How many colours? Are there any patterns you can see?



Challenge – can you write a description of a shape for your family to guess?

7. Decorate and make a paper aeroplane, how far does it fly? Can you measure the distance it has travelled?



8. Using toilet rolls, kitchen rolls or empty plastic bottles to play a game of bowling, how many did you knock down? Can you record this as a number sentence?



9. Find five objects in your house which begin with the letter of your name. Can you have a go at writing down the names of the objects that you have found?



10. Sort your toy vehicles, animals and/or cuddly toys into categories based on their similarities and differences E.g. How many wheels they have, can fly or cannot fly, wings or no wings or how many legs they have.



Challenge – write a sentence about one of the doodles you have drawn. Why is that something that your hands enjoy to do?
