

Indoor Home Learning Grid

1. Using Lego, Duplo or some other form of construction, can you build a house for the three bears? Can you build them some beds/chairs for them?



2. Think about ways Goldilocks could be kind to the three bears as a way of saying sorry. Write down three acts of kindness she could do for the bears and draw a picture to go with each one.



3. Can you make the three bears some more breakfast? Use your teddies and some pretend (or real) food. Can you share out 3, 6 and 9 pieces of food equally? How much do they have each? Can you share out 10 pieces of food equally? Why/Why not?



4. Can you paint/ make a picture of Goldilocks? Can you use any of your recycling to help make her face? For example you could use strips of cardboard for her hair!



5. Be a tricky word detective! Can you look at a book and see how many tricky words you can find? (I, the, to, into, he, she etc.) Then write them down.



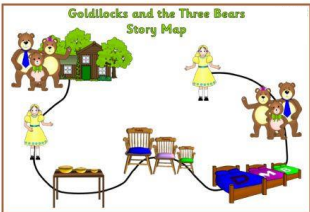
6. Can you write/draw pictures for your own version of Goldilocks and the Three Bears? What happens in your story? Does Goldilocks break something different? Does she get caught by the three bears at the end?



7. Sort your toys into colour groups. How many different groups do you have? Is there a group for toys that have more than 1 colour?



8. Can you draw a map of the route Goldilocks took from the woods through the three bears' house? Which room in the house does she go in first? Where does she go after the living room?



9. Can you thread the cheerios on to dried spaghetti? Use blutac or play dough to hold the spaghetti up in place. You can also use penne pasta if you haven't got cheerios.



10. Can you act out the story of Goldilocks and the three bears?
