

1. Worms come to the surface when they hear rain on the ground. Sometimes noises convince the worms that it is raining and they come up to the surface. Can you make up your own rain dance? E.g. 10 stamps on one foot, 10 stamps on the other foot, 6 claps, 5 bunny hops, 2 spins and then shout 'rain'.



2. Superworm makes himself into all sorts of different things. Can you think of something else he might be? Can you draw a picture of your Superworm? Can you write two sentences about him using tricky words? E.g. He is a He likes



3. You will need two people and some wool/string. Cut your string into worm sized pieces and hide the worms around your house. Set off hunting for the worms, come back to the same place and tie the pieces together. The winner is the person with the longest worm. If you struggle to tie knots use some sticky tape.



4. Worm painting.
You will need: Paper, paint in different colours and some string.

Fold your paper in half to see the middle line and then open it back up again. Cut your string into different lengths, making sure there is enough for you to keep hold of when in-between the paper. Take a piece of string, dip it in the paint leaving an end free of paint to hold on to. Next, lay the paint covered string on one side of the folded paper in any pattern, leaving the clean end of the string out of the paper. Fold the paper back together and put your hand on the paper, so you can feel the string through it, and begin pulling the string out whilst moving it around. It's really fun to have more than one string with a different colour. Pull the string out and open up the paper to reveal your creation.

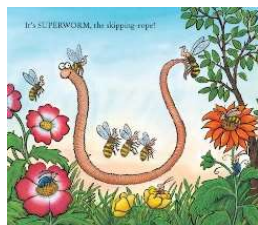


5. Design a superhero costume for Superworm to wear.

6. Can you move like Superworm? How many super moves can you do in 1 minute? Superworm the skipping rope. How many skips can you do in 1 minute? Can you hula hoop for 1 minute? Can you use your body as a swing (swing your arms)? Can a grown up time you?



7. How many different ways is Superworm used in the story? Can you make a new page in which Superworm helps a different animal? Can you draw a picture and write a sentence to describe what is happening?



8. Superworm is super long, but how long is he? Draw a picture of a worm and split your worm up into at least 10 sections. Fill in your worm as if it was a number line starting from 0. Repeat this, but start at different numbers.



9. Can you write a note to Superworm to thank him for all he has done to help the insects in the story? E.g. To Superworm, Thank you for helping the toad. You are kind. Love from, Mrs Pritchard. Can you read back what you have written?



10. Discuss Superworm's special powers. If you could have a special power what would it be? Why would you like that special power? Superworm used his special powers to help others, who helps you? How do they help you? Can you draw/paint a picture of your superhero?
