

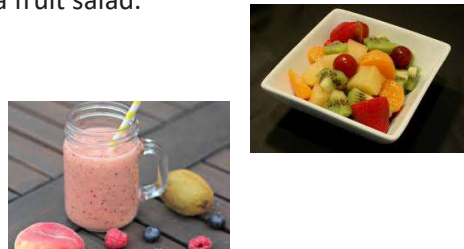
1. Draw a face on a potato to make your own Supertato! Take Supertato around your house to help out with some of the jobs, such as tidying your bedroom and putting away the dishes. What other things can he help you to do?



2. Use building bricks to make a house for your Supertato. Think about how tall and wide it needs to be to be able to fit Supertato inside of it.



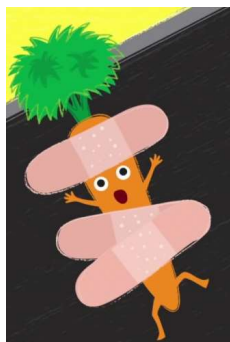
3. When eating your lunch, discuss which parts of the meal are healthy and good for your body. You could then make a healthy snack such as a fruit smoothie or a fruit salad.



4. Think of at least two words to describe Supertato, e.g. friendly and helpful. Talk about the following scenarios and decide whether the person is being friendly and helpful like Supertato or unfriendly and unhelpful. What would you do in these scenarios?

- Your friend has a sore arm and cannot join in your game, so you change it to another game that she can play.
- Your teacher asks you to help her with a task and you say no because you are too busy playing.
- Your friend asks you to help him with a game he is playing but you don't want to so you just ignore him.
- When your mummy or daddy tells you it's nearly tidy-up time, you start tidying away your toys.

5. Write a sentence to show what you think the character in the picture below might be saying or thinking.



6. Can you make a picture by printing with potatoes? Ask a grown up to cut out some shapes in the potatoes and use them to either make a picture or a repeating pattern.



7. Make a bowl of jelly and add in some fruit, e.g. strawberries, raspberries and blueberries. Once it has set in the fridge, your jelly is ready to eat. What does your jelly taste like? Do you like the jelly? Why or why not?



8. Design and then build either a den or a fort. Think about the different things you have around your house that you could use to make your den or fort. Can you make it big enough for you to be able to sit inside of it?



9. Play a game of Roll a Superhero. You will need a dice, a piece of paper and a pencil. What will your superhero be like?



10. Create your own code. Draw a picture to match each letter of the alphabet and then write a word/message for someone to try and decode. Make sure that each picture starts with the letter that it is representing e.g. drawing a picture of a 'cat' for the letter 'c'.
