Dear Parents & Carers

We hope you are as excited for your children to be back at school as we are and that you are looking forward to a very important term ahead. We are sure you will agree that this term is a significant term in the life of your children as they will embark on their last full term before they finish at Wintringham. Please find below a summary of the main learning areas during this first term, along with some general reminders.

Homework

· Reading - children are expected to read for at least 10 minutes, 5 times a week from their AR book and this should be recorded in their reading diary (date, name of book, page number) and signed by an adult. The number of reads will be counted up each Friday so children must ensure that they have their reading diary and their AR book with them (along with a 100 read book if they have one of these too). AR club will continue to run.

. CPG books – children to complete one test per week (directed by the teacher). This will change back to Maths.co.uk once the SATs have been completed.

P.E.

P.E. for Year 6 will now be on a **Wednesday**. This may be subject to change so please ensure that a P.E. kit is in school all week. Please ensure that your child has the appropriate clothing and footwear in school for these lessons: a white t-shirt, navy or black football-style shorts (not cycling shorts), trainers, a warm top and jogging trousers (if it is colder). Please also ensure that all children have a named water bottle in school every day.

We are looking forward to an exciting term ahead and thank you in advance for your support.

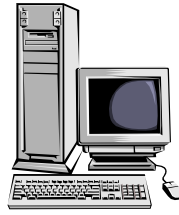

Art

Our theme is 'Making Memories'. This unit gives pupils the opportunities to develop skills creating interesting sculptures and compositions, experimenting with different materials.



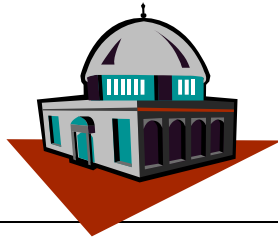
ICT

Religion and Worldviews

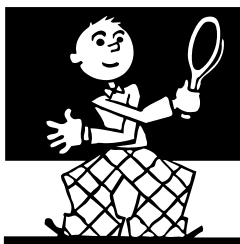
The children will be looking at answering the question 'Why is there suffering?'

The music unit for this term is focussing on music from South and West Africa.



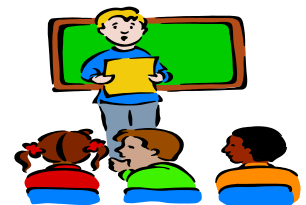
P.E.
