English, reading & Maths

In English, we have started to read the book "Arthur and the golden rope", written by Joe Todd-Stanton. In the next few weeks, the children will be writing a discussion on whether Arthur should save the town. They will then be writing a narrative, including direct speech of some of the different characters.

In reading, the children will be reading extracts from different themes such as, great women in history, graphic novels and books related to British science week.

In Maths, the children have come to the end of finding strategies to add and subtract 2 digit and 3-digit numbers. We are now starting to learn how to use the column method for addition.

Foundation subjects

In PE, the children have been learning some tennis skills with a workshop run by Nick Peck. In the next few weeks, the children will be developing their fitness and gymnastic skills.

In History, the children have been learning about The Tudors. They will be learning about who Henry VIII is, how he impacted religion and what Tudor houses looked like.

In Art, the children will be creating their own Egyptian scrolls, looking at Egyptian art and taking inspiration from these.

In Science, we will be exploring light and shadow. They will be investigating how shadows change throughout the day.
