### English & Maths

In English, we are continuing to read the book "Stone Age Boy" by Satoshi Kitamura. In the next few weeks, the children will be writing a narrative which includes dialogue to rewrite a part of the story. They will then be writing a letter to the character Om from the boy's perspective, now that he is older, to thank her.

In Maths, the children will be continuing their learning about numbers to 1000. We will be looking at the place value of 3-digit numbers and how these can be partitioned. We will then be looking at where 3-digit numbers are on a number line and identifying the nearest 100 and nearest 10 to specific 3 digit numbers.

### Foundation Subjects

In Science we have been exploring "Rocks and Soils". In the next few weeks, the children will be looking at how fossils are formed.

In Religion and Worldviews, the children have been exploring the learning question "Where do our morals come from?", focusing on the difference between rules and guidance.

In Music, the children will be learning the lyrics to the ballad "Space Oddity" and creating actions to go with it.

In French, the children will be learning how to introduce themselves as well as asking how someone is and responding how they are feeling.
